

Assessing the Problem

Using research skills, assess the problem you have chosen for this week's assignment. It can be a current event that is relevant to the course, [POLI 330N Week 6 Assignment: Current Event - Free and Fair Trade or Budgetary Issue](#) as a mass extinction event, or it could be something that affects your community in a more direct way, such as a war. In any case, you will need to find a recent article (less than one month old) from a reputable news source concerning a Free and Fair Trade or Budgetary Issue between at least two countries and summarize it for the highest possible score.

Current Event? Free and Fair Trade or Budgetary Issue

One of the most interesting aspects of free trade is the cross-border movement of goods, services and people. This influx of cash and labor is not always a welcome development for poorer nations, as it can be a major cause of economic stagnation and poverty. To counter this nefarious activity, governments often employ policies such as free trade agreements that reduce tariffs and other barriers to trade. Moreover, many countries have established supranational organizations to facilitate the [nhs fpx 4000 assessment 2](#) funds across borders, such as the Basel Committee on Banking Supervision and the International Organization of Securities Commission. In other words, a well designed and executed free trade agreement could be the spark that turns a struggling economy around.

However, the best way to judge a good trade deal is to take a long hard look at the nitty gritty, and the following suggestions can help you achieve that goal: assessing the problem, the solution(s) and implementing measures to ensure that it gets done right.

Case Study

A case study is a form of research that is used to examine issues and situations in an in-depth manner. Unlike other types of research, case studies are conducted in real-world settings and have a direct impact on the lives of the people involved in them.

The method is also used to teach students by allowing them to take ownership of their learning. This approach "entails the student being responsible for formulating their own questions and participating in the process of answering them" (Boehrer 1990).

It should start by identifying the problem that needs to be studied and then explain what would happen if the problem is not addressed. It should also describe the ideal [applying research skills sj](#) that would exist if the problem was not present.

Case studies are best used when an experimental design is either inappropriate to answer the research question or impossible to implement. This allows researchers to explore phenomena that are otherwise unreplicable, such as the ability of a child who suffered severe abuse to learn language.

However, case study research has been criticised for lacking scientific rigour and providing little basis for generalisation of findings. This can be overcome by using theoretical sampling, respondent validation and ensuring that the whole research process is transparent.

Summarize a recent article (less than one month old) from a reputable news source concerning a Free and Fair Trade or Budgetary Issue between at least two countries.

Many people rely on news websites to keep up with current events, but trust in the media is at an all-time low. Because of this, it is important to find unbiased news sources.

Free trade involves removing [nhs fpx 4000 assessment 2 applying research skills sj](#) and tariffs on goods, with the aim of increasing economic growth among involved countries. Fair trade, on the other hand, involves trading partnerships between companies and working communities, aiming to remove pay discrepancies between nations and promote workers' rights and good working conditions.

It also aims to minimize exploitation in the trade market, reduce violations to environmental and human rights standards, and empower producers to earn their living. It also protects the rights of small-scale farmers and artisans by paying them equitable prices.

However, there are a number of disadvantages to free trade. It can lead to job losses in some industries, and it can also put a country at risk of tax havens, where businesses are able to relocate to tax-advantageous locations that offer lower costs of production.
